

Western River Permit Team Proposal

We haven't had a locally organized Western River trip for several years. While we could plan a western trip any year, we wouldn't be able to paddle most of the good rivers because they require permits. In one recent River Magazine, there was a list of all US rivers that require permits. The article indicated that the waiting time for some permits is ten years!

I propose that we form a "Permit Team" with the following mission:

Secure at least one permit for all US rivers on an ongoing basis.

1) Organizing The Team

- a) The team decides on the list of rivers for which we will apply for permits.
- b) If we have more interested paddlers than rivers, we will apply for multiple permits for some rivers. Two permit applications are better than one!
- c) We will have a lottery to decide who will apply for the permit for each river. Even though you have a favorite river, there may be others who want to do the same river trip, so you may not get to be the permit person for your favorite river.
- d) After the lottery, individuals may trade rivers.

2) Maintaining Permits

- a) You are responsible for maintaining your permit application annually.
- b) Some permit systems have annual keeping fees.
- c) In most cases, if the renewal is late, you loose your place in the queue and must start over again.
- d) Loss of current application priority means you are immediately off the team.

3) Who Gets To Go On A Trip

- a) Permit rules usually dictate that the permit holder must be on the trip.
- b) If you are on the Permit Team you are guaranteed a spot on all other Permit Team trips.
- c) Since the number of participants is limited on some permits, the permit holder will choose the remaining participants. If you are not willing to be an active participant in the team, you might not be invited. (No pain no gain, no tickie no washie!).

- d) Permit fees are factored into shared trip costs when and if the trip happens.
- e) The trip fees will be split equally between each of the trip participants.

4) Planning Trips

- a) The permit holder does not have to be the trip leader.
- b) Trip leaders, especially on large wilderness expeditions, require respect.
- c) The permit holder should organize sub teams to plan meals, purchase food, pack gear, rent equipment, hire guides, and organize shuttles.
- d) The permit holder and trip leader are responsible for decisions concerning safety. They make the difficult decisions to cancel based on high water or draught.

Rick Harrington had a permit to The Middle Fork of the Salmon River in Idaho. It was very well organized trip. I'm sure Rick can give us some tips. For Rick's team there was a sub team who planned, bought, and packed all meals. Others organized the raft rentals, guides, and shuttle support.

Pulling off a trip requires a lot of work with various talents. Everyone can participate in some capacity.

How to get involved

- I will schedule a meeting leading to a permit party.
- We may even get two permits in one year! So start saving vacation time. Those with significant others should start saving brownie points.


This is only a proposal. Comments are welcome until we draw the names.

There are three FLOW membership categories:

- 1. Individual Membership
- 2. Family Membership
- 3. Commercial Membership

All memberships are based on a calendar year.

Individual Membership

- Cost: \$30
- Includes ACA membership
- Receive FLOWlines (monthly newsletter) including regularly updated paddler lists
- Listing on club members' list
- May place a short (45 words max.), free ad in the "Classified Ads" section to sell personal paddling equipment.

Family Membership

- Cost: \$35
- Includes ACA family membership

- Receive FLOWlines (monthly newsletter) including regularly updated paddler lists
- Each family member is listed on the club members' list
- May place a short (45 words max.), free ad in the "Classified Ads" section to sell personal paddling equipment.

Commercial Membership

- Cost: \$150
- Receive FLOWlines (monthly newsletter) including regularly updated paddler lists
- Free 1/8 page ad in each issue of FLOWlines
- Listing in "Contacts" section on page 2 of FLOWlines

Anyone may take out an ad in the FLOWlines. The advertiser will receive a copy of FLOWlines which contains their ads, without the paddler list.
