Sea Kayaking on San Francisco Bay

From Sausalito below the Marin Headlands, cross the channel to Angel Island, a former Civil War camp. Time the landing in the surf at Pearl Beach just right to avoid a pounding on the sand and stones. Or wait for an evening with a full moon, cross Richardson's Bay, round the tip of Belvedere, and paddle to dinner at Sam's in Tiburon, before heading back in the moonlight.

Paddle under the Golden Gate Bridge - a narrow, tumultuous gate between the Bay and the Pacific Ocean. Know where the shipping channels are and how fast the tide is going out to avoid landing in the Potato Patch outside the gate.

There are islands inhabited only by birds. One island was formally inhabited by the best criminal minds in the country. Another island boasts a historic lighthouse — where a lighthouse keeper and his family still live. Be prepared to have a sea lion pop up next to your boat - or a wayward humpback whale.

This is not a flat water paddle across a serene lake. Paddling the Bay is a lesson in planning, in reading the tide tables, in determining the speed of the wind and the current, in navigating in and out of the shipping channels, and in safely reaching your destination with enough time to return to your launch site.

Come and enjoy an evening of slides and narrative about one of the most active and beautiful waterways in the world.

Fall Creek Slalom Race

Sunday, April 1, 2001

The sixth annual Fall Creek Slalom Race will take place in Ithaca, NY on Sunday, April 1. This is a class II to III whitewater slalom race with 20 to 25 gates for open canoe, C-1 (decked canoe), and kayak.

Since Fall Creek is a natural flow stream, water conditions can range from easy class II to a pushy class III. All paddlers should be prepared to make a judgment as to whether or not the course is within their ability on the day of the race.

This annual race is designed to introduce paddlers to the sport of slalom racing. The race is held on Sunday, with Saturday reserved for course construction, practice and clinics. These are questions usually answered in multiday seminars, but it never hurts to go over some basics and remind everyone how important it is to really know these things.

This will be a fun evening hosted by several speakers who will each teach us something we might be happy we were reminded of this coming paddling season.



Paddlers Wanted For Extended Paddling Trip

Churchill River, Labrador June 16 – 30, 2001

Ed McDonald and Santtu Ollila are planning a trip down the Churchill river in Labrador, Canada. The river flows 200 miles from the Churchill Falls hydro project to Goose Bay. Although it is not a true "wilderness river," the Churchill's appearance remains largely unchanged from pre-Columbian history. In this section of the river, there are no roads crossing the river, and dirt tracks approach the river at only two points — Gull Island Rapids and Muskrat Falls. Thus, the adventurer must rely on his or her own planning skills and judgment. In many ways, it represents an opportunity for the experienced paddler to move to the next level of wilderness tripping.

This river is somewhat unique in its relative accessibility insofar as one can drive to both the put-in and the takeout, eliminating the need for bush pilots and boat pickups. Despite the relative accessibility of the river and its power and beauty, it has been a grossly under-utilized recreational resource with perhaps less than a dozen trips down its length per year.

This may be the last chance to paddle the river since final planning is underway to harness the energy remaining in this flow in two additional hydro projects at Gull Island Rapids and Muskrat Falls.

Ed McDonald paddled this river in 1998 with his fifteen year old daughter in an open canoe, accompanied by his friend who was paddling a touring kayak.

Ed has several motives in going on this trip. One is to share an experience with other people who might appreciate it in the same way that he did. Another is to mobilize as many people as possible to demonstrate that there are other potential economic benefits in some of the other as yet untouched river systems which might come under scrutiny for hydro power development in the near future. You Too Can Help to get More Releases on the Lehigh

At the March FLOW General Meeting, Jerry Hargrave and Bill Kuipers gave a presentation that outlined their years of diligent work that were instrumental in the releases we now enjoy every summer on the Salmon. They told of lots of hard work and dedication to their cause.

As paddlers, of this and other venues that have been fought for, it would be commendable for us to add a bit of our own time when called for, to help keep the battle for more access and more water alive. A few minutes at a keyboard, or with a pen, or telephone from us all can add up and bring on a huge difference.

I was called this month by a representative of the Philadelphia Canoe Club. It appears they have found a viable way to get more water, more often, on the Lehigh River in Whitehaven, Pennsylvania. The simple relocation of an access road at the dam, which has a history of flooding over where it now sits, will increase the pool retained behind the dam five-fold — which is all water that needs to be spent sooner or later!

PCC is one of the Northeastern clubs we share information with, and they have appealed to us to join them in a letter writing campaign. Their local Senator and his children are paddlers with PCC, and are frequent users of the Lehigh. He is offering his support in return for something that can only begin with letters from paddlers like us...

What follows is their appeal:

Dear Paddlers and Friends of Paddlers:

Pennsylvania State Senator Stewart Greenleaf has been, for the past year, working to increase the number of scheduled water releases out of the Francis E. Walter Dam into the Lehigh River. The first step in this effort is to have the access road, now located at the bottom of the dam, relocated to the top of the dam. Toward this end, Senator Greenleaf has written to U.S. Senator Arlen Specter and requested that Senator Specter insert language in the upcoming Energy and Water Development Appropriations Bill so that \$300,000 can be allocated to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the engineering and design phase of relocating the road.

Federal agencies, working with the National Recreational Opportunity Study, have been mandated to enhance recreational opportunities on our dams and lakes both in-lake and downstream. If the road behind the Francis E. Walter Dam can be relocated to the top, the Corps of Engineers will have more flexibility in storing water and scheduling releases.

Senator Greenleaf has requested that the paddling community and friends of paddlers write or e-mail Senator Specter in support of the appropriation. Please help us in this effort by communicating with Senator Specter and by passing this request along to as many people as possible within the next two weeks.

Please keep your message brief. Suggested wording would be:

Dear Senator Specter:

I am writing today to ask you to support and insert a \$300,000 appropriation request in the upcoming Energy and Water Development Appropriations Bill which would allow the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to prepare plans and specifications to relocate the present Francis E. Walter Dam access road to the top of the dam.

The sudden and unexpected flooding of this access road is a public safety hazard. I would appreciate any assistance your good office can lend to correcting the situation.
