# Beaver River Rendezvous Rescheduled For July 14-15

The annual Beaver River Rendezvous—typically scheduled for Labor Day weekend in the Adirondacks of upstate New York—has been shifted to the weekend of July 14–15 for the 2001 paddling season.

The change was necessitated by construction work at the dam on the Beaver's Stillwater Reservoir. Lake levels at Stillwater are being drawn down through the summer to accommodate repairs to the dam and by September water might not be available for the Beaver's traditional fall release season.

Consequently-the year 2001 will feature a special one-time summer release weekend with water available on all three of the Beaver's creek runs — Moshier, Eagle and Taylorville. If water conditions permit, additional releases will be scheduled at

# 2001 Salmon River Festival July 7-8

Saturday, July 7th will be the first ever night festival at the Salmon River Kayak Festival. Boaters will have the opportunity to enjoy optimal flows of 750 cfs during the day, and enjoy the festival atmosphere in the evening.

The festival activities will start promptly at 5pm, with the Ringgold Fire Department hosting a chicken BBQ. Fire Chief Larry Phillips states, "We're looking forward to working with American Whitewater and the kayaking community during the festival." The Fire Department will be selling chicken dinners, as well as hot dogs, soda, and beer. They will also be sponsoring the bonfire, which will belit at dusk. Taylorville and Eagle in during the normal September period.

"We knew that Stillwater is going to be drawn way down by the first of August," said Beaver River coordinator Chris Koll, "and since Stillwater feeds all the sections of the Beaver, we were facing the real possibility that there just wouldn't be water for the releases in September."

"Fortunately, Orion Power was willing to negotiate this special release weekend in July when the Beaver has a surplus of water from the early drawdown," Koll said. "We just hope that we can get the word out to boaters who have been traveling to the Beaver for the past three years that the river will be running in July."

If past experience is any indicator—finding boaters to paddle the Beaver shouldn't be much of a problem. Last year's Rendezvous drew nearly 300 boaters to upstate New York.

The July 14–15 weekend will feature a Taylorville release on Saturday from 10 am to 2 pm followed by an Eagle release from 1 pm to 5 pm. Sunday will include a release at Moshier from 10 am to 2pm with another release at Eagle from 1 pm to 5 pm.

The releases are a product of negotiations by American Whitewater that resulted in a series of 11 whitewater releases during a typical year spread over three challenging sections of Beaver River whitewater. The sections are dry except for release days when Orion Power allows water to spill back into the natural river bed creating whitewater runs ranging from class 3 to class 5.

There will be two events on Sunday.


#### • Paddle with a Pro
