
FLOW Pool Practice Schedule

FLOW Deliberates Merging with GWC

For several months the leaders of the Genesee Waterways Center (GWC) and FLOW have been discussing combining forces for the mutual benefit of the two organizations. FLOW originally started as a spin-off of the GWC in 1996. GWC's mission is to introduce and promote human-powered watercraft - canoeing, kayaking, and rowing - to the people of Monroe County. The GWC has renovated and operates two boathouses in Genesee Valley Park. GWC operates the Lock 32 Whitewater Park and offers instructional programs for youth, adults and disabled people. GWC is a registered 501c-3 not-for-profit organization. We have attempted to summarize here the advantages and potential disadvantages of the association in order to broaden the discussion and expand the public discourse.

Under the merger, the GWC could provide FLOW members (1) free access to the GWC boathouse, restrooms and docks, a meeting site year-round, and winter boat storage at minimal cost; (2) GWC Outrigger Canoe, Kayak, Rowing program discounts (3) expanded \$5 FLOW days at Lock 32; (4) a single membership to both organizations; today this costs \$55, and the combined membership is expected to cost \$35; (5) a legal 501c-3, tax deduction for membership and other contributions to the association; (6) a more comprehensive insurance policy than offered through ACA; (7) extensive educational programs for novice paddlers, providing an entry point for new and younger paddlers in the area; (8) programs and facilities for open-water boaters at Lock 32 and Genesee Valley Park; (9) extensive education, safety, conservation and certification programs for novice to advanced paddlers, providing a platform for significant membership growth. The structure and leadership of FLOW would remain autonomous, although we would probably add an officer called "GWC Representative" to the Steering Committee. FLOW would probably need to allocate separate funds for insurance and Paddler Magazine. It is anticipated that the combined organization would retain an affiliation with ACA, the details of which have not been worked out. FLOWLINES would add pages to report outrigger canoe and rowing news.

The merger of the two organizations is still at the discussion stage. This article is meant to spur discussion and debate so that both organizations make the right decision. Members are encouraged to add your opinions to the discussion. A survey or poll could be taken at the Winter Party in late January.

Lehigh River Dam Modification

A while back we circulated a request to our membership asking for letters to be written to help advocate for this. The following note is proof that firing off letters **does** have an effect. This could lead to more releases on the Lehigh, where many have been cancelled in the past because of lack of water behind the dam.

A few months ago the American Canoe Association and American Whitewater supported PA State Senator Stu Greenleaf's proposal to move a road that runs acrosds the upstream face of the Francis E. Walter Dam on the Lehigh River to the top of the dam. This dam, near White Haven, PA, releases water into the popular Class II-III Lehigh River Gorge. Currently, using the full capacity of thre dam floods the road. Moving the road will allow more water to be stored at this facility and make whitewater releases more reliable and frequent.

Senator Greenleaf called me today to announce that he was suiccessful in getting an appropriation for a feasability study of this project. He is on line to obtain funding for the improvemenbt in 2003. He would like to thank American Canoe Association and American Whitewater for their help; their letters were useful when dealing with PA Senator Spector's office. We may need paddler support in the future, and we will keep you informed as things develop.

Stu is a long time friend of the whitewater paddler. I worked with him to set up the Tohickon whitewater releases way back in 1977, and he was instrumental in helping the Philadelphia Canoe Club in their efforts to keep the running of Flat Rock Dam legal He is an avid kayaker, and although his responsibilities keep him off the water more than he'd like, his sons Stu, Chris, and Ryan all paddle Class IV-V Whitewater.
