Sea Kayaking In Italy

The following interview was received from an old sea kayaking buddy, Barbara Kossy, from California. Barbara manages to do what so many of us wish we could do – that is combine love of paddling, travel and making a living all at the same time. The original article was published in the "Half Moon Bay Review".

Ever thought about taking a sea kayaking trip along the coast of Italy or one of its nearby islands? Didn't think so. But one of your fellow Coastsiders does all the time, so much so that she organizes regular sea kayaking trips to Italy.

Barbara Kossy, a resident of Moss Beach, started kayaking in 1989, and is married to John Dixon, a member of the extreme condition sea kayaking group the Tsunami Rangers and the 2001 winner of its annual Sea Gypsy race. Kossy developed a passion for the stunning beauty of the Mediterranean coast in 1995 and met some Italian kayakers in 1996. She tells the Review how she found a connection between her interest in kayaking and her love of Italy, and turned it into a profession.

Review: So you've now been to Italy 11 times. Tell me about your first trip there.

Barbara Kossy: The first time I went in 1983, I went because of art. I have an MFA from the Art Institute of Chicago, and I read a book called 'The Rare Art Traditions' by Joseph Alsop, and it focused a lot on Renaissance art. In 1983, I had the opportunity to

do some traveling and I designed a trip for myself throughout Europe that ended up in Italy with plenty of time to look at art.

R: How did you get involved in sea kayaking in Italy?

BK: I started kayaking in 1989, so when I went back to Italy in 1995, it was clear to me that it would be a great place to kayak. The Cinque Terre region has a lot of water in and around it, and I noticed lots kayaks lying on the boat ramps around there, so I asked people in my broken Italian where I could rent a kayak. Once I found one, I thought how great it would be to set up a trip where you could just paddle from hotel to hotel.

So before I went back to Italy again in 1996, I wrote to the Italian Sea Kayaking Association, and at that time I was the president of the Bay Area Sea Kayaking Club here, so I wrote them and played up the fact that I was active in this organization with lots of members, and I proposed some exchange situations.

They wrote back and invited me to join them on the island of Elba. So I went there by myself in September of 1996 - it was sort of a leap of faith - and we just had a great time. It was so exciting. There you are in your kayak, which is a very familiar thing, but then there's the coast of Italy and the villas and town on the coastside, and you can have gelato or pasta and hear church bells ringing. It's amazing.

R: And how did you hook up with the folks at Sea Kayak Italy?

BK: I got along really well with the people on that first trip, and these same people were involved in a little kayaking school and tour operation. And they told me that they knew that there were more kayakers in the U.S. than in Europe, and asked if I'd be interested in bringing American kayakers to Italy.

Since I had some background in marketing and publicity and I knew lots of kayakers, I agreed, and we designed a two-week trip and I went to find people to come on the very first trip. The very first trip was is 1997. Ever since then, at least once a year, there has been a trip to Elba.

Infections are the leading cause of river related injury among paddlers

Oftentimes these are simply minor ear and sinus infections that are hard to trace to a specific river or source of pollution. Lately however, reports of dangerous Staphylococcus (Staph) infections have come in from paddlers in several parts of the country.

These infections were likely linked to specific rivers. In an attempt to find and stop the sources of the pollution causing these serious health problems, and to better understand the problem, American Whitewater is asking that all paddlers who have been diagnosed with a Staph infection in the last year that they feel could be linked to a river that they paddled send us responses to the following questions:

- When did you get a staph infection?
- What type of staph was it?
- What rivers had you paddled in the 8 weeks prior to the symptoms?
- Where do you think you got the infection?
- What symptoms did you have?
- What treatment was sought/received?
- Any additional information?

We will not use, nor do we need your name to respond to this issue. This is likely the first of a series of posts that we will make in response to this potential problem. As we narrow in on the geographic and biological parameters of the potential problem we will educate paddlers on what can be done and what the source of the problem is.

If you have had a potentially river-related staph infection in the last year, please email responses to the above questions to kevin@amwhitewater.org with the title "Staph Infections" in the subject box.

Thanks, and American Whitewater will continue our commitment to improving water quality across the county. As we once said in a public hearing, "We do not eat the fish from this river, we are the fish in this river."

Sea Kayaking In Italy

When I went there two years ago, a lot of the Italian kayakers I had met would talk about going to Sardinia, kind of like how we would talk about going to Baja or Costa Rica. So I said, 'Let's do a trip in Sardinia,' and we did the first Sardinia trip

in 2001. As it happens, Keith Miller and his wife, Tammy Borachevsky, who own California Canoe & Kayak in Oakland, came along and liked it so much that they decided that they wanted to do a collaboration between California Canoe and Kayak and Sea Kayak Italy. So in September we're doing two one-week trips plus another 11-day trip.

R: Compare life on the Coastside to life on Sardinia or Elba islands.

BK: There are similar issues. Elba, as an island, is a very large natural park with a ton of natural resources. There are 45 different species of wild orchids on Elba, and even though it has been occupied since at least 800 B.C., there are still a lot of environmental treasures there. To me, the contrast between here on the Coastside, which has only been occupied for a very short time, and Elba, where there is no stone that hasn't been affected by people, is very interesting.

Another interesting concept is urban planning. Human occupation at Elba is all concentrated in the middle of the island, with all open space around it for farming. There isn't this idea that everybody has to have a free-standing, single-family dwelling with an acre of property around it. In California, the idea is that density is bad,

but there are certain contradictions in that because dense areas can be very exciting, and they can also preserve the land around them.

R: What would people who know you be surprised to learn about you?

BK: I worked on the movie 'Nightmare Before Christmas' as a 'character fabricator.' I made the puppets, and I'm in the credits. I worked on the movie for four months, which was the minimum required to get on the credits.

R: Do you have a favorite Bay Area kayaking spot? How about in California?

BK: The nice thing about kayaking is that depending on the time of year the favorite spots tend to shift, depending on the conditions. I've enjoyed Tomales Bay and Mendocino, and paddling on San Francisco Bay is incredible. Going under the Golden Gate Bridge is always amazing. I've seen whales before while paddling in San Francisco Bay.

I even enjoy urban paddles. I'm going on a paddle from Isalais Creek in San Francisco at Third Street and Cesar Chavez to Pac Bell Park and back, through a little urban creek. A lot of people don't like the urban paddling, but I would paddle up a drainage ditch if I could.

R: Where haven't you yet kayaked that you would like to?

BK: I've heard that the north shore of Molokai is great, and I'd like to explore Norway and Scotland. With kayaking, though, once you know the weather, coast and water conditions are safe, you can paddle just about anywhere where there is two feet of water.
