Swap Meet

Date: Saturday, March 25, 2006 (If you're going boating, stop by on your way! Or drop stuff off the night before at Cathy and Ed's at 27 Oxford Street, near University in Rochester – 585-721-5153. See consignment info below.)

Location: Genesee Waterways Center near the bridge over the Genesee River at Plymouth and Elm-wood Avenues, near the University of Rochester, behind the skating rink. See map on *page 5*.

Time: <u>8am - 9am –</u> Sellers check-in and set up. <u>9am – 1pm –</u> Swap Meet/Late seller check-in <u>1:30 pm –</u> All boats and gear must be packed up and taken home. Arrangements can be made if you're going to be on the water.

Time to get serious about boating gear for 2006. Get out all of your last year's gear and bring it to the swap meet. That will give you plenty of room for all the new gear you're planning on buying this year! We're looking for boats, boating equipment, outdoor equipment, camping gear – flatwater, whitewater, canoes, kayaks, anything and everything. Bring your stuff to the FLOW Swap Meet. A \$10 donation to FLOW by **boat** sellers is required for registration. It's a \$5 donation if you're just selling gear. You can sell your gear yourself, or have FLOW sell it on consignment for you. If you choose the consignment option, 10% of the selling price will be donated to FLOW, and all items must be clearly marked with a price and seller's name and phone number. Buyers and browsers can enter for no charge.

Everyone is welcome – members of FLOW, nonmembers, families. No credit cards, but cash and checks with two forms of ID (as long as the seller agrees) are accepted. One or more of our local paddling shops will be represented with some great discounted gear. Coffee and donut holes – no charge! (While they last.) If you are unfamiliar with the event, the beginning of the course starts at Mill Drop Falls, a scenic 170 year old mill built just south of the Village of Shortsville. The route heads north along a waterway that was once home to a dozen or more paper mills, lumber mills, flour mills, and electrical plants that harvested the water's power. Even though the mills and their workers have long since disappeared, the power of the water is still observed and experienced through the production of adrenaline, bruises, and laughter which take place during this exhilarating spring event.

The run continues thru the Village of Shortsville with some of the best rapids and viewing areas located conveniently within the Village Park. From Shortsville, it continues north into the Village of Manchester and finishes just before the Route 96 and Thruway crossings.



Even if you are not planning to exam, if you travel on NYS lands, especially with a group, you need to know the regulations for your travel and leave no trace camping.

2006 FLOW Annual Budget Report

Attached you'll find our 2006 FLOW budget, along with a comparison of how we did against our proposal for 2005. Bottom line is that we did well in light of some very difficult financial decisions in 2005.

As you look over the budget realize that your budget pays mainly for:

1. ACA coverage

2. our two main social events each year; Winter Party and Summer Picnic.

3. donations to causes we support as a Club such as AW, NY Rivers United, GWC, Salmon Fest and Lockapalooza.

4. other miscellaneous expenses to keep the Club running such as our web site, pool practice insurance certificates, membership renewals, food at general meetings, etc.

You'll find that our balance declined year-on-year (beginning 2006 versus year-end 2005) due to the Steering Committee's decision to cover the unanticipated ACA insurance increase for every Club member in 2005. And although not obvious in the 2006 budget please realize that again we are absorbing another increase for every member from our treasury in 2006. What this means is that FLOW's income was \$5 less than normal for every membership in 2005 and will continue to be \$5 less in 2006. But as you can imagine, this cannot continue forever, so we 're working with ACA to see how to stabilize increases. We are also communicating to each of you about any ways that we can keep increases as painless as possible, while still retaining all the benefits that we each enjoy.

Please look over the 2006 budget, and as always, if you ever have any questions or concerns about the Club's finances, budget or otherwise, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Finally, you'll be happy to know that the fiscal health of the Club is solid and we look forward to the future.




