Lock 32 Grand Opening Delayed

Because of the still ongoing situation with the Canal Corp, GWC decided that we can't open until we receive a permit. GWC believes that the permit should take around three weeks to process and it was sent in a week ago. So they figure that we can open the lock by June 1. More details on that will be posted on the FLOW Message Board.

The brief history of the situation is that GWC has not had a permit from the canal corporation to operate at Lock 32. In order to build at the Lock, we needed a permit. Our application was filed a week ago, which didn't leave enough time to get it in time to open for the season. This Year at Lock 32

Events

Lock 32 Opening Night—Friday, May 11, 2007, 4 pm to dark. See article on page 1.

Lockapalooza— Saturday, August 18. Western New York's premier whitewater kayaking festival. We plan to expand the free clinics with guest instructors, including Fergus Coffey of Zoar Outdoor and Expediciones Chile. We'll also have the slalom, boatercross and freestyle competitions.

Lock 32 Finale— Wednesday October 10. One last night of paddling to put the baby to bed.

Clinics

Lock 32 instructors will put on at least six free two hour clinics for GWC members this season (we might announce more soon). Our aim is to cover all the topics that you need to kick your boating up a notch. All of these clinics are appropriate for someone who has just learned kayaking, but will cover information that will make a seasoned boater even better. This means that you get 12 hours of instruction plus a season pass for the Lock for only \$165. If you got the same amount of instruction elsewhere, the cost would be somewhere around \$200.

Just a general guideline for all the clinics: The skills you need for ALL of these clinics are

- 1. You should have taken an ACA Introduction to Whitewater Kayaking class OR be familiar with all of the stuff covered in it AND
- 2. be fairly comforable boating and swimming (for the Swiftwater Rescue clinics) at the Lock. That's it! These clinics don't require you to be a super boater to learn anything. For some, like the cart-

wheeling clinic, newer boaters will get a lot out of the first half and not quite so much out of the second half. Folks who have been boating awhile will be reviewing and refining for the first half and then (hopefully) learning more during the second half. But, everyone should get something valueable out of all of the clinics. Got a new camera and now I want to use it. Here's the plan: We'll run through some basic strokes (power, sweep, brace, sculling draw, side-slip) and review the techniques. Then we'll briefly review some more ad-

vanced maneuvers like stern squirts, pivot turns, double-pumps, etc. If you don't know how to do some of these things, that's fine. We're just looking to get a review of where you're at right now. Then we'll have you all do them for the camera. Afterwards, we'll review the video and break it down, analyze the technique, etc. For those of you who've never done video analysis, it really helps show what you're actually doing, which is often far different from what you feel you're doing. It's especially helpful learning stuff that you're struggling with.

PERFECTING EDDY TURNS / THE DRAW FAMILY



We'll work on getting into and out of eddies smoothly and quickly by breaking down the eddy turn technique into speed, angle and lean. We'll spend the most time on angle, because that's the factor that will take your boating to a higher level, especially if you're interested in creeking or big water boating. To control our angle during eddy turns, we'll learn the family of draw strokes, including the straight, sculling, bow, stern and gliding draws and work on using all of these strokes in combination. We'll also cover how to change your technique to accommodate different water features.

PADDLING CENTER

INTRODUCTION TO PLAYBOATING / CARTWHEELING

This clinic will cover the foundations of playboating. We'll start with pivot turns and lean cleans, learn the stern squirt (the coolest trick in the book), hit the double pump and lean cleans, and work up to cartwheel-

SWIFTWATER RESCUE -- PART I

***Please bring whatever gear you'd bring to boat at the Lock and any additional rescue gear that you have and might conceivably have in your boat (ropes, biners, pulleys, med kits, etc.).

- -Rescue Priorities & Philosophy-- NO NEW VICTIMS, KISS
- —Throw bags-- types, throwing, care, etc.
- -Knots-- overhand, figure-eight, butterfly, bight knots and retraces
- —Swimming (self-rescue)-- with boat and paddle, defensive, aggressive, over eddylines, through holes
- —Wading rescues-- with paddle, with buddy, circle, pyramid
- —Boat based rescues-- Hand of God, boat over boat empty, bumping and towing



SWIFTWATER RESCUE -- PART II

- —Review of rescue priorities, throwing ropes and knots
- —Assisted Swimming rescues-- Tethered swims (aka live bait), v-lowers, zip lines
- —Mechanical Advantage-- vectors, z-drags

SWIFTWATER RESCUE -- PART III

- -Foot Entrapment
- —Strainer Drill
- -Review of mechanical advantage
- —Practice



In addition, ACA failed to respond to repeated phone calls and emails to the point where our volunteers were wasting countless hours trying to contact them. FLOW was not the only group to dis-

band from ACA in 2007. Complicated insurance requirements and the poor club relations caused quite a few clubs to venture out for themselves.
